"Green Infrastructure is based on the principle that the need to protect and improve nature and its processes, as well as the many benefits on human society, can be integrated into landscape planning and development. Realizing green infrastructure in urban areas reinforces the sense of community and helps to combat exclusion and social isolation. This approach benefits both individuals and the community on the physical, psychological and socio-economic development".

The Green Infrastructure serves the interests of both people and nature. It should be designed and managed as a multifunctional resource capable of delivering a wide range of benefits on the same spatial area.
